#### 3. Focus on Your Desire to Make a Difference

Highlight why you want to contribute and create change. Your passion for making an impact is one of the strongest things you can show.

# 4. Reflect on Your Experiences

Think about how your personal journey, both in life and work, has shaped who you are. Consider how these experiences can contribute to the YAG.

## 5. Skills Come from Everywhere

Don't limit yourself to work or school experience. Think about teamwork, leadership, and problem-solving skills you've gained from other areas, like volunteering, hobbies, or family responsibilities.

# 6. Use the STAR Approach

Structure your examples using STAR (Situation, Task, Action, Result) to clearly communicate your experiences and achievements.

## 7. Write Naturally, Not Perfectly

Don't worry about flawless grammar or writing style. What matters is that your answers sound like you—authentic and true to yourself.

#### 8. Leave Time to Review

Give yourself plenty of time to complete your application. This allows you to come back to it with fresh eyes, check for any errors, and ensure you're happy with your responses.

# 9. Proofread and Ask for Feedback

Always proofread your application aloud, and don't hesitate to ask friends or family for feedback to make sure it reads well.

#### 10. Do Your Research

Show that you've taken the time to learn about the CEC and YAG. This demonstrates your commitment and interest in the role.

#### 11. There Are No Wrong Answers

Trust yourself—what's important is that your answers reflect who you are and your experiences.

#### 12. It's Okay to Boast a Little

Don't be shy about your achievements. It's okay to highlight what makes you proud and what sets you apart.

You don't have to finish your application in one go. Take breaks and come back to it when you're ready to refine your responses.
