

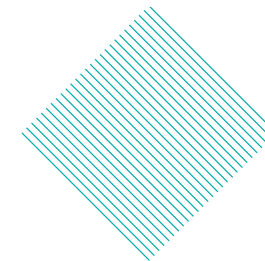
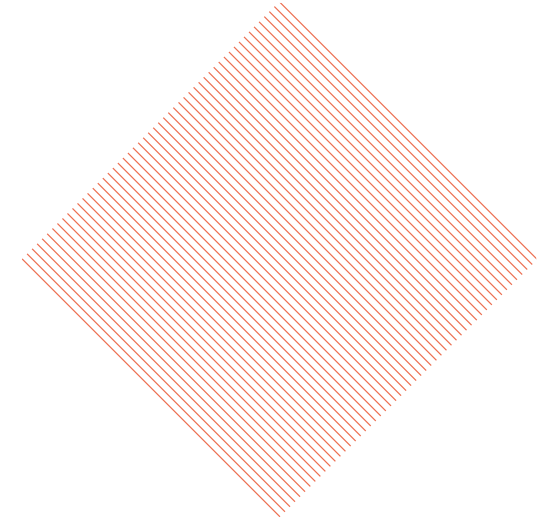

Our mission is to help **every** young person to find their **best** next step.



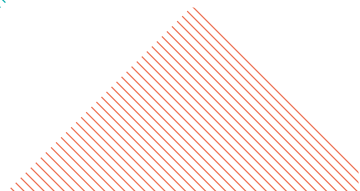
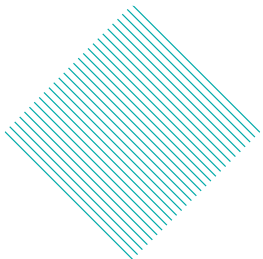
Why were Enterprise Advisers introduced?

- **Connect and learn:** You will join a national and regional Network of driven business volunteers. You will build your personal and professional network and improve your knowledge of the education system

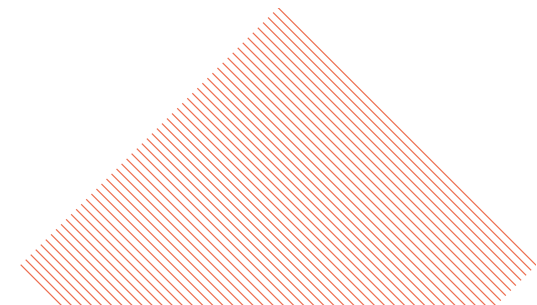
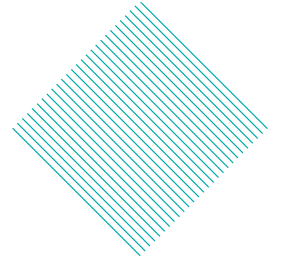
