This letter confirms a variation to the grant that was awarded on 29th March 2023 to The Careers & Enterprise Company so that more young people benefit from high impact careers support. The value of this grant variation is £2,827,500 for the period 04/07/2023 until 31/03/2024 and is in addition to the core grant of £29,700,000 which is for the period 01/04/2023 to 31/03/24. This additional funding will build on the activities already agreed within the core GFA to ensure full roll out of careers infrastructure is achieved more quickly and Ministerial priorities are met sooner. This additional funding is subject to the Department for Education Grant Terms and Conditions in line with the 'Business-as-Usual' GFA.
